Please note the MDGA will not be hosting its Summer Doe & Youth Shows due to the 2022 National Show.

1. The Senior/Junior COMBINED Doe shows are sanctioned for the following breeds: Alpine, Lamancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Recorded Grade and AOP (Toggenburg, Guernsey and Sable). The Junior Doe shows are sanctioned for the following breeds: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Recorded Grade, and All Other Purebreds (Saanen, Sable, Toggenburg, Guernsey). The Senior/Junior Combined and Junior shows ARE separately sanctioned.

2. Early Entry fee per doe per ring is \$6.00 for members and \$11.00 (non-members) if received on or before Sunday, May 15, 2022. Regular Entry Fee is \$12.00 per ring per doe for members and \$17 per ring per doe for non-members if received between Monday, May 16 and Wednesday, May 25, 2022. NO entries will be accepted after Wednesday, May 25. No day of show entries. Substitutions are permitted on the day of show. Entry fees must accompany entry form. There will be no refund of fees for any reason. No faxed entries will be accepted.

Pen fees are \$5/pen and pens are 6' x 6'. We are not able to guarantee empty pens between exhibitors in the goat barn. If not purchasing pens, there is a \$10 flat fee for showing out of your trailer/truck. STRAW WILL NOT BE PROVIDED; you will need to bring your own. Exhibitors MUST clean their pens out at the conclusion of the show before leaving. The fairgrounds will charge extra if they need to go back and clean your pens, so please be sure that all manure and used bedding is placed in the roll-off off the dock area for the mushroom people to pick up. For a small fee, youth exhibitors may be available to clean your pens for you should you so choose.

4. NO SHAVINGS. Absolutely no shavings! There can be no shavings or trash in the used bedding pile that the mushroom people pick up.
5. Please check chart onsite for pen assignments, pens may be labeled in advance.
6. Entries may be entered online or emailed to Skybirdacres@gmail.com. If using PayPal, please send payments to mdgatsr@gmail.com as a Friends and Family transfer so PayPal fees are not taken out. 7. The base date is 5/28/22, which is the date the animal is to be judged.
8. The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.
9. The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.
10. No copies of the registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams, or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
11. A health certificate must be shown to the show officials at the time of unloading. Interstate health papers are required for all animals coming from outside MD. Required for all MD shows** A "Livestock Exhibitor's Self Certification of Animal Health" must be filled out by the owner/caretaker prior to loading and must be presented upon request to the designated Festival/show official or MDA Animal Health Official. This form can be found either on the reverse side of the 2022 MDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or at the MDA website www.mda.state.md.us Any animal showing signs of infectious or contagious disease, as determined by the show officials and/or health check-in official, will be barred from the show. Tattoos may be checked. The decisions of the show officials are final. MD Intrastate Health certificate required of all in state herds.
12. Animals must be in place and checked in by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, check-in will be open no later than 7:00 a.m. and will be released at the conclusion of the show.
13. Judging will begin promptly at 8:30 a.m. Breeds will be assigned to each ring and the judges will rotate rings while the breeds are shown in the same rings.
14. Tentative Breed Ring Assignments. We are planning to have all three show rings in the main show ring this year. Secretary tables will be located outside of each show ring. Please bring your show books to rings/bleachers that you will be showing in. Note: Show order is subject to change subject to emergency as determined by the show committee.

15. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. Only American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society, and Canadian Goat Society registered, recorded, or applied for animals may be shown in an official American Dairy Goat Association show.

16. MDGA, ADGA, and the Howard County Fairgrounds will not be responsible for loss, damage, or accident to any person, animal, or property. Show entry indicates acceptance of this condition.

17. Due to the recent pandemic, you should be prepared to provide your own meals and beverages.

18. We will be holding a 50/50 raffle during the show.

19. In addition – MDGA will follow the local city, county, state health regulations that are in place at the time of the show. By submitting an entry to this show you acknowledge that you are aware of the risk of showing at this event, of exposure to Covid 19. If you or any member of your party is sick, please stay home. Bring your mask – it will be announced at the show if you will be required to wear one in the ring and check-in area by a mutual decision of the judge and show committee.

20. Exhibitors may arrive after 6 pm on Friday, May 27, 2022. Please note that there will be two other events on the fairgrounds on Saturday.

Directions: Howard Co. Fairgrounds are located very close to the intersection of I-70 and Rt. 32. From I-70, take Rt. 32 south ½ mile, turn R on Rt. 144. Take Fairgrounds Rd. on the right. I-70 is the easiest route to take if coming from the North, East, or West. If coming from the South, I-95 to Rt. 32 is probably the quickest route to take.
